COVID precautions

- Request that all children have taken a lateral flow test the night before. Please report any positive cases to Mr Perry immediately.
- All staff will take LFTs the night before and daily during the trip. Centre staff do tests twice weekly.
- There is a room allocated for anyone displaying COVID symptoms who needs to be collected. We
 will administer painkillers for headaches (if authorised) and will notify you of this. However, if
 your child displays other symptoms such as persistent upset tummy and temperature, then we
 will call parents to collect. Please be advised that we may call in the night.
- School groups are kept separate in the canteen and staggered timings.
- All equipment is cleaned and quarantined between schools.
- Children use hand sanitiser before using any equipment e.g. climbing wall.
- Sanitising stations outside all buildings and enhanced cleaning inside bedrooms.
- All adults wear masks during indoor activities.

- Please make arrangements so that children can get to school for 8:15am.
- Once children come to school, suitcases go into the hall.

Accommodation Commodation

- There are options of multi bedded dorms (8 10 beds) for students; some are en-suite.
- Teacher rooms are situated within the same building as the children.
- Senior Staff Members are on duty until 10:30pm each day with Night Staff patrolling between the hours of 10:30pm and 07:30am.
- Centre doors are secured in the evening, but can be opened in case of emergency and security barriers guard the entrance to the site.
- All bedding is provided, but children need to bring their own towels.
- All rooms are accessed via keys and are lockable from the inside.

their room allocation once at Condover.



Clothes
