Dear Parents/Carers,

We would like to share with you the results of an inspection that took place on 4th December – a Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS). In a similar way to Ofsted, all Church of England schools are visited regularly to evaluate the key question:

How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling all pupils and adults to flourish? Under the new SIAM's framework that came in this September 23 we were inspected on the six questions below to see if the school was able to live up to its foundation as a Church school. The new criteria are exceptionally rigorous and challenging; exploring the way a school strives to fulfil the questions below:

How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision enable pupils and adults to flourish?
How does the curriculum reflect the school's theologically rooted Christian vision?
How is collective worship enabling pupils and adults to flourish

spiritually?

•How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision create a culture in which pupils and adults are treated well?

•How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision create an active culture of justice and responsibility?

•Is the religious education curriculum effective (with reference to the expectations set out in the Church of England's Statement of Entitlement for Religious Education)?

We are delighted to tell you that we received an overall judgement from the inspection that Audlem St James' Church of England Primary School is living up to its foundation as a Church school.

Our wonderful ethos and environment is thanks to the energy, skills and commitment of our whole school community – staff, parents, children and governors. It's a huge team effort and we feel so fortunate to be part of such a supportive and caring 'family'.

There is also clearly a great deal of work that goes on behind the scenes to build upon those strong foundations to ensure that children receive the best education and wider opportunities, and flourish as in our school vision. The strengths of the school are listed below:
